Setting Goals and Developing Action Plans

Good Monday morning to all 2020-21 Presidents-Elect in Rotary District 5680,

It is hard to believe that in just over two weeks we will gather in Wichita to share Rotary fellowship and learning. Your planning team is excited and looking forward to meeting you. If you have not yet registered, **DO SO TODAY. Deadline for registration is ASAP.**

Last week, we hope that you had the opportunity to further your knowledge about our Rotary Foundation and the importance of supporting it.

1. Did you help encourage others in your club to donate to our Foundation so that your club could meet its Foundation goals or become an **EREY Club** (Every Rotarian Every year)?
2. Do you have that part of your leadership team in place? Have you identified your club's **Foundation Chair** and **Committee** for your Presidential year? Are you encouraging those Rotarians to start to learn what they need to know about the Foundation and determine if the club will continue with the same plans and goals from current Rotary year or create new plans for the upcoming year?



This week, you have several “to dos” to ensure that your officer, board and committee chairs team will begin to think about their 2020-21 goals which will include supporting appropriate service projects. We are sure that you are aware that your club’s program of service is often the life blood of your club and of Rotary. ***It is through the hands-on participation in Rotary projects that members become engaged. And remember, engaged members stay in Rotary!***

Rotary is involved in **6 Areas of Service** including Community, International, Youth, Vocational, Club and New Generations Service. As President, you have the responsibility to ensure that there is a balanced program of service based on your member input and desires. It is critical that projects are the appropriate size for the club’s human, time and financial resources. However, projects can also inspire Rotary clubs and members to extend themselves and accomplish what they never thought they would or could achieve. So, below is a list of this weeks “to dos” for which we hope you will complete and learn.

1. **Final check** – did the names of your club’s President, the President-Elect, Secretary and Treasurer get uploaded through Club Runner to Rotary International.
2. Read “**Your Projects**” in your **Lead Your Club: President 2019-22** manual, pages 61-67
3. Review **Appendix 8: Rotary Service Options** in your **Lead Your Club** manual on page 66. How many of these service options is your club currently involved with?
4. Request that your Program Chair find a knowledgeable speaker about some of the Rotary Service options that your club is **not** involved with.
5. Review all the Club’s proposed Service Projects to see if they fall within Rotary’s **Areas of Focus Policy - Rotary’s Six Areas of Focus**, for which you should have had an opportunity to read about last week
6. Ask your International Committee Chair and other interested members to explore opportunities for an international service project such as participating in a water project, education project or other project in another part of the world.
7. Ensure that your designated Service Project Committee Chair or Chairs are aware of the “Club Service Projects Committee Basics” Rotary course in the Rotary Learning Center. Encourage the Chair and committee members to review this short 45-minute learning plan. Have them go to <https://learn.rotary.org/members/learn/catalog>. Rotarians must log into My Rotary to access that area of the website.
8. **Encourage your officers, board members, and committee chairs to begin thinking about their Goals and Action Plans for 2020-21.** After PETS, your team will want to be working on these goals so that by the time your leadership team takes its place on July 1, you will be ready to hit the ground running and have a successful transition and a year of inspiring your club and your community.
