   If not, Rotary has provided many reference and amazing resources <u>Use these tips</u> to create a club logo for your website, social media accounts, and other marketing materials.
- Rotary Responds to crisis in Ukraine—In response to the humanitarian crisis caused by the war in Ukraine, The Rotary Foundation has designated the Disaster Response Fund as the main avenue for contributions. It has also invited districts to apply for disaster response grants to help people who have been affected. The Foundation received more than \$13.1 million in contributions through 30 April, and so far, 74 grants totaling \$2.1 million have been awarded. Districts can apply for disaster response grants through 30 June. Learn more about Rotary's response to the Ukraine crisis and about how to apply for a grant.
- Rotary members in Ukraine are distributing supplies from other countries, organizing long-term aid, and helping their neighbors settle back into their homes – despite being affected by the war themselves. Ukraine District 2232 has received four disaster response grants of \$50,000 each from The Rotary Foundation, which together will fund nearly 50 relief projects across Ukraine. Read more about their efforts in the face of adversity.

Please note the following for Rotary Foundation (TRF) Contributions:

- Credit Cards: Online via www.rotary.org must be authorized prior to 30 June 2022, midnight (CST).
   Phone (866-976-8279) contributions will be accepted through 5:00PM CST on 30 June 2022.
- Checks: Both the postmark and the date written on the check must be no later than June 30, 2022 and received by The Rotary Foundation by July 7, 2022.
- Wire transfers: Must be initiated prior to Thursday, June 30, 2022 and received by Thursday, July 6, 2022.

Please do NOT send in checks for the 2022-23 Rotary year until July 1, 2022. All checks received with June postmarks go toward 2021-22 contributions.


