Message from District Governor Martin Bauer

Dear District 5690 Rotarians,

August is Membership month for Rotary International. I hope each of you have asked another person to join Rotary. This can take some recruiting efforts on your part. Research is showing that particularly

younger professionals are more likely to join Rotary if you start by inviting them to share in a project so they become engage with how we benefit the community. Inviting them just to a meeting may not be the best place to start. We are excited that our District successfully had an increase in our membership last year. The goal is to get our District's membership back to 1,700 in 3 years. This is an achievable goal but only if every Club and Rotarian make membership a priority.

Very few of the Clubs in our District have set their goals for giving to the Rotary Foundation. This needs to be done on line at MyRotary. With these goals,



we have a better gauge on how we're doing as a district to our goal. The goal is that we reach an average of \$120 per each member of Rotary in our District. There are 5 clubs in the District that far exceed this average. If we could reach this goal and the

membership goal, we could fund \$50,000 in projects in the District EVERY year. Please do your part. The District leaders in the area of grants had some wonderful training about improving our access and use of grant money from the Rotary Foundation and are meeting August 20th to set some policies. We will provide club training at the District Conference, October 17-18, 2014 at the Marriott East in Wichita.

Sunday, September 7, 2014, is Rotary Day at the Kansas State Fair. Come participate in the activities and see the ShelterBox and other Rotary displays. If a group participates from your Club, you would get credit for a Rotary Day if



Serendipity and Community Service in Andover

Recently, through a bit of divine intervention, the Andover Food Bank stopped by our Rotary meeting to tell us about their program and the families they serve in the community. What we as Rotarians learned was that a wonderful community organization was in need . . . and that set in motion a series of events that came to a successful conclusion during a recent City Council meeting with the presentation of the final \$1,000 of the \$2,433 donation from the Andover Rotary Club.



When representatives from the Andover Community Food Bank (housed at the Andover United Methodist Church AUMC) shared with us the wonderful service they provide for our community members in need we were impressed. When they

shared that the needs of the community were more than 30% higher than expected and that their shelves were rapidly emptying, Rotarians went into action. In a partnership between the City of Andover, the Andover Rotary Club, and the Andover Community Food Bank, almost \$2,500 was raised in just over two months that will allow the Food Bank to restock their shelves and continue to provide services to those in need throughout the rest of the year.

The City of Andover had approached the Rotary Club to see if we could provide volunteers to staff the beverage carts at the Little River Band concert at Andover Central Park. While this was before Rotarians knew about the needs of the food bank, we thought it would be a good way to raise funds to support the community of Andover and were thankful for the opportunity. Shortly after we learned of the shortages at the Food Bank and it became clear why this opportunity was placed at our feet.

By working the concert we raised \$2,000 from the city (funds they did

not have to pay employees to staff the carts) as well as an additional \$433 in tips that were subsequently donated to the Community Food Bank to help them bridge this difficult time. It is through partnerships like this that we can all serve our community as well as one another. The Andover Rotary Club is grateful for the opportunity to serve, as well as the wonderful relationship that exists between our city leadership and the community civic organizations. This is one more small reason that Andover, KS is the best community to raise a family in our region.

Rotary Day at the Kansas State Fair



New Foundation Funding Model

The Rotary Foundation Trustees have approved a new model for funding the Foundation's operating costs. Effective 1 July 2015, the Foundation will direct 5 percent of Annual Fund donations to administrative and fund development expenses and to build a strong operating reserve. The Foundation will also draw on other funding sources, including 5 percent of cash contributions for global grants. Most not-for-profit organizations allocate a percentage of their contributions to support future fundraising efforts. Looking ahead, the Foundation will continue its strong record of financial accountability and transparency.
