My wife, Tina, and I have been fortunate enough to have taken both of our anti-Covid shots. I was indeed lucky, having almost no reaction to either lifesaving dose. Tina had some limited symptoms from the second "little stick," mild fever, headache, some discomfort and swelling in right arm. However, she said it was much better than having a bout with the "regular flu".

An aside on the "little stick." My injections were over before I realized they were going to stick me. The needle size is the thinnest I have ever seen used for an injection. There was no noticeable stinging sensation.

Lest you think I am oblivious to needles, to the contrary, when just five years old, I was tested with rack after rack of syringes for allergic reactions. Over six decades later, in my still vivid memory, each syringe was pushing one foot in length.

So, it took much determination to over-

come my apprehension of inoculations. I had great examples to emulate. My father, who cheerfully faced the discomfort and sometimes pain from his lower body, left ravaged by Polio. I never once heard him complain.

And there were the Jensens, Julius and his sons, Doc and Benny. Getting ready to go on wheat harvest with them, as a 15 year old, I watched as Benny sliced his hand open on a jagged piece of metal. He reared his head back and laughed, as he walked to the house, got a needle and thread and sewed it up, literally singlehandedly.

Laugh in the face of danger, keep smiling when we are confronted with adversity! Some might say those are foolish ways to deal with very serious problems.

But in reality, we are much more likely to be successful in overcoming our fears, if we keep a positive, upbeat attitude and calmly address and move forward to deal with the situation.

Tina and I so looked forward to coming to see every one of our 60 precious Rotary Clubs and Communities, in person!

However, Rotary International has requested, for the safe-

ty of all concerned, that we not meet with you in person through the end of June. At this point, it will have to be by virtual, Zoom meetings. We'll do our best to get to as many of our 60 Clubs as we can!

If we are not able to fit in a virtual visit, for even a Project or a Board Meeting, we will be glad to do our best to make a special video available, to be shown to your Club.

Exciting New Incentives for PolioPlus Campaign!



It appears that some of us may have overlooked making our life changing PolioPlus goal, while working our way through the Pandemic. We are substantially below our goal of raising \$100 per Rotarian to End Polio Forever!

We now see firsthand what a raging worldwide virus can do. We must not let Polio come back, when we have the opportunity to end it's horrific effects, like we did by eliminating smallpox!

RI President Holger Knaack tells us finishing off Polio, as we have pledged as Rotarians to do, is still our number one priority!

To provide additional incentive, Tina and I are offering to provide a \$50 match to our District's Clubs that raise/ donate an average of between \$50 and \$74 per Rotarian and \$75 per Club for averaging between \$75 and \$99.

\$100 or more per Member still gets a \$100 match from the two of us.

At a Districtwide average of a little bit over \$50/ per active member, WE can still get to an overall contribution of \$1,000,000, with matches.

WE can do THIS! Donate what you can or have a feel good PolioPlus fundraiser, please!

If we average \$40/member more than we have already raised, or \$13 and change for the next 4 months till July 1, we can get there. We need and count on Every Rotarian's Support!



From Gladys Maldonado in Cucuta, Colombia – our \$81,000 project—Global Grant #2218461

Today was a different day.

A day that shows us that in the midst of the global uncertainty due to the virus, we can do great things, without leaving home.

The Pandemic hid our smile with the masks, it prohibited hugs, meetings, visits, celebrations, it has stolen friends from us, however the pandemic has not managed to diminish the fibers of our hearts, nor to appease our dreams, they are there in each awakening, alone it is enough to look around us to observe some need and allow our heart to speak ... He in a harmonious way with The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International and in complicity with the Supreme Being, come together to generate important changes.

It was approaching noon and I received the expected e-mail, the one with the good news, the one who with a phrase "Your global grant project Number 2118461 has been Approved" generates smiles that no mask can hide.

This time it is about helping five Educational Institutions, located in vulnerable neighborhoods of my city, highly needy, where a high percentage of students have dropped out due to lack of technology equipment to re-

ceive their classes remotely. They do not have connectivity, they spend their days at home, most of them with their parents, who lost their jobs because of the situation, their greatest illusion previously was, everything they learned and shared at school.

The Pandemic stole from them, not only the smile, the meetings, the celebrations, the games, the hugs. The Pandemic robbed them of their education.

The Rotary clubs of Cúcuta joined, and thanks to the generosity of an excellent Rotarian and friend Bill Davis, Honorary member of our San José de Cúcuta club and the international contact club Rotary Club League City, plus multiple clubs and districts of the world that joined In this wonderful project, we will bring education through global grant project Number 2118461 to sectors where there is currently none.

It can? Of course you can, I'll be telling you details later.

Let's not waste dreams. On the contrary, let's look for them in each awakening!

Thanks to Rotarians in our district and several others, a dream will be coming true for hundreds on children in Cucuta, Columbia. Thank you! - Dave Abbott, D5680 Global Grants Chair

Another Global Grant in Columbia

Global Grant #2095558 - This global grant #2095558 was to purchase medical equipment for the Hospital in Cucuta, Columbia located on the border with Venezuela. This Hospital treats numerous refugees that cross the border from Venezuela. This was a joint effort of 7 Rotary Districts lead by the Houston TX District. This grant is complete except for the review of 100 vulnerable patients, (Dr. Juan Carlos Vegel), and the relication (sic) of 60 mammograms and 60 breast ultrasounds, which will be finished on April 30, 2021. This could not be done before due to the Covid pandemic. This only represents an approximate

of USD 4,300. The balance has already been spent for Medical Equipment, and everything is working fine!

Delivery of the equipment to Erasmo Meoz Hospital was covered by the local news.
