### LAST CALL FOR GOVERNOR NOMINATIONS

The month of November begins the process for selecting the District 5680 Governor for the 2025-2026 Rotary year. One of the most important things a club can do is to allow the district to benefit from your club's leaders by encouraging them to be a District 5680 leader.

Clubs are invited to submit their suggestions for nomination for Governor of District 5680 for the Rotary Year 2025-2026 (July 1, 2025—June 30, 2026) no later than January 15, 2023. To be eligible for Governor, a candidate must have the qualifications and agree to accept the duties of a Governor as set forth in the 2022 Manual of Procedure (MOP). Earlier this month, DG Ivanhoe Love sent copies of the applicable pages of the MOP as well as other important documents related to the nomination of a district governor to all club presidents via email.

## **Clean Water For Ukraine**

A project of **Rotary District 5680** (Kansas & Oklahoma) and **Districts 1440, 1450, 1461, 1470, and 1480** (Denmark)

Our goal is to provide water purification units for communities devastated by the war in Ukraine. We are partnering with District 2232 in Ukraine to distribute the units to areas hardest hit by the war's destruction of water purification facilities and power plants.

- Six Rotary Districts are spearheading the project.
- Each unit can provide 150 gallons per hour of clean water and is tailored to the impurities for a particular location.
- Units are portable and can be operated by a 12-volt auto battery.
- Units can be truck mounted to efficiently serve multiple neighborhoods or villages.
- Each unit costs \$4,000 \$5,000 (€3,900 €4,700).
- Our goal is to provide a minimum of 50 units.
- Target date for funding the project is January 30, 2023.



Will your club join us in this effort? Consider raising funds to provide one, two, three, or even more water purification units.


