Dear Fellow Rotarians,

Our year began with Holger Knaack's theme " Rotary Opens Opportunities!", chosen even prior to the Coronavirus becoming the Covid 19 Viral Pandemic.

To put this pandemic into perspective, the last global pandemic killed multiple millions of souls around the world over 100 years earlier - the influenza pandemic of 1918-1920.

Over the past year and one half, Rotarians, while often as socially isolated as others similarly situated, learned to be resilient. We have, by and large been able to withstand or recover quickly from, difficult conditions.

Rotarians also had to be adaptable, tenacious, irrepressible, steadfast and perseverant.

Through all the challenges that we were mostly able to embrace as Opportunities, We Rotarians carried on. We persevered. We emerged more capable and determined than ever to maintain our relationships with other beloved Rotarians and to continue to serve where we are needed!

We accomplished much together. Two Food for Our Neighbors Projects enabled our 60 Clubs to distribute nearly onequarter million meal servings of nutritious and life sustaining Food to those neighbors across our Kansas-Oklahoma Rota-



ry District. That was done with the able assistance of F & A Foods in Concordia, which delivered pallets of the dried, processed, and containerized meals from the Outreach Program in Des Moines, lowa, to delivery hubs, with Clubs

there making handoffs to other area Clubs, a bit like the old Pony Express. All that, while it was still difficult for our clubs to carry out service projects, due to public safety protocols, such as social distancing and wearing masks.

Prior to our Virtual District Conference, over 60 Rotarians and family members gathered in Newton, properly masked and distanced, to package 16,000 meal servings, to be sent wherever needed. We also shared a meal and much needed Rotary fellowship.

Unable to have an in-person District Conference, the District Leadership Team, especially Kurt Harper, Fred Heismeyer, DeAnn Sullivan and Kent Erb, very capably helped your DG plan, produce and carry out an entertaining and inspiring Conference.

Featured were such headliners as: the irrepressible Jennifer Jones, our RI President-elect, as of this July 1st; Xavier Towson, DG of the San Antonio TX Rotary District, straight-talking with us about our Nation's painful color divide, after the tragic and unnecessary murder of George Floyd and too many others;

Bill Tobin informed us about Shelter Box's disaster relief around the Globe and how we can help; Jason Browne, a Rotarian from Pennsylvania, shared a timely message about how we can interest and engage new Rotarians of diverse skin tones and backgrounds; and I shared my family's story of dealing with and overcoming the physical effects and mental challenges of polio. My Mother, Irma Ames Brewer, who contracted polio while pregnant with me, succumbed to the deadly Coronavirus November 12th.

In March, we partnered with our sister Rotary District 5710 (Northeastern Kansas) for the second virtual Heartland PETS. This was led by DGEs Fred Heismeyer and Vern Hendricks, District Trainers DeAnn Sullivan and Neil Wakefield, and Kelle Thompson, PETS Coordinator (5680), and Mandy Shelton Executive Secretary (5710).

Throughout this last year, your Leadership Team has been vigilant about identifying Opportunities to help wherever possible to hold off and eliminate that dreaded Virus. We have worked with Kansas Leadership Center to develop local community responses to inform our neighbors that the vaccines are safe and effective.

We again partnered with District 5710 to sponsor Public Service Announcements on Public Radio stations with coverage across all of Kansas and the Oklahoma Panhandle, to share messages promoting the safety of the vaccines and promoting vaccinations to avoid the worst of the symptoms of Covid, including severe lung damage or death.

Now 5680 and 5710 are collaborating with other partners to provide factual reassurance to our region's parents of school children. Each child and parent vaccinated gets us closer to being able to provide safe, in-person education for those children, this August!

And for those concerned about getting our communities and economies fully reopened, see to it that you and your friends are vaccinated, lest you be part of the main reason keeping that from happening, unvaccinated adults old and bright enough to know better. A whopping 98% to 99.7% of people admitted to US hospitals with a Covid diagnosis were unvaccinated, in several recent studies.

And the Delta Covid Variant, which is reported to be much more contagious, is already causing mini surges in places like rural Missouri, and in some counties in Kansas, where fewer than 30% of those who can be vaccinated, are!

According to Robert Mendoza PDG and the prior District Foundation Chair, this year's total of 10 Global Grant projects, funded with close to \$100,000 of District Deferred Funds, were some of the highest numbers ever, for Our District! Thanks to Donna Meier Pfeifer District Rotary Foundation Chair and Dave Abbott, Global Grants Subcommittee Chair.

The Local Grants Subcommittee, Chaired by PDG Andrea Krauss, had a successful year with many projects approved, but around \$7,000 was left unclaimed, due to not having enough qualifying projects submitted. Deadline for this year is July 31st, so don't miss it! Every community needs something, find it!

One of District 5680's accomplishments, of which I am extremely proud, because it it comes from each Rotarian and Club that contributed, is raising over \$530,000 for PolioPlus' End Polio Now Campaign, including all available Matches. As a result, about 177,000 of our world's children will be fully immunized, and their life dreams will not be threatened by childhood diseases as they walk or run confidently towards their future!

The shared Service of Us, the combined power of "we" gets results. Ask Us because We can do it! Let no Rotarian be left behind, share Rotary kindness, carry on with joint devotion to each other and Our Mission of Service Above Self.

Thanks to each and every one of you who served in a leadership role in our District this year. Read down through the District Directory. You will find impressive, dedicated Rotarians, without whom many of our District's programs would not happen.

Special thanks to my wife Tina, who doesn't realize how much her encouragement and support helped me stay focused and carry on. To Kurt and Kelly Harper for creating the roadmap for serving our new, shared Rotary District.

To Fred and Joyce Heismeyer, Ivanhoe Love Jr. and Gloria Homeier, who make up the rest of the talented DG string, you all have great hearts which will reveal opportunities every day to lead us in serving others by meeting their needs. Show the rest of us how to help you and encourage us to meet those challenges.

Thanks for the privilege of serving as your District Governor. Doing so has provided me with many more experiences in our shared Rotary journeys, which continue to show me how life-fulfilling Rotary Service is!






